Wedding on a budget: the elegant side of frugal

With the average wedding cost in the United States reaching \$26,720, it is only natural that couples are looking for ways to save money while making beautiful memories. Here at FFEF, we have compiled a list of simple ideas to help save you money while planning your wedding.

Carefully Consider The Date And Time:

One of the most romantic aspects of your wedding is setting the perfect day and time to exchange vows, however, did you know that there is even more to consider than the sentimental value of your wedding date? That's right! The particular day and time you choose to say "I do" could cost you considerably more than other days! Generally speaking, late spring to early fall is prime wedding season, and that means from May through October, you will pay higher prices. Winter weddings are always considerably less expensive with the exception of December and February thanks to Christmas and Valentine's Day. Planning a winter wedding can save you money and should pose no problem if your wedding venue is indoors. Of the days of the week, Saturday is the most popular day, which means you will pay more, while weekdays and Sundays are the least expensive days to hold a wedding.

Solicit Help From Your Friends And Community:

You may have heard the term "Many hands make light work" and it's true. The more people that volunteer to help, the easier (and cheaper) your wedding plans will come together. Asking your friends and any community organizations that you may belong to for help, including church, military or work related communities can get you many free or cheap things, including but not limited to a venue, decorations, a wedding officiant and last but not least, many additional helping hands

Stay Stationary:

Holding a wedding and reception in the same place just makes financial sense when you consider the extra costs of throwing a wedding and reception in two separate venues. The simple fact is, the additional expenses of various rental fees, transportation and the exorbitant cost of decorating two places are utterly unnecessary. Use the money you save to go on a luxurious honeymoon or start a savings nest egg. Dump Tradition And Be Creative:

Many people are dropping expensive flowers in crystal vases for more rustic and natural decorations. Everything from fruits and vegetables; candles and mason jars; potted plants, flowers, and herbs to tree branches and pine cones are used for beautiful wedding decor. Stunning centerpieces have been made by artfully collecting greenery and tree branches in large glass vases. These perks extend to gently used wedding dresses as well, and with simple resources like tradesy. com, bridalgaragesales.com, and wedding-recycle.com, it's easy to buy and sell used wedding decor. Also, you get brownie points because you helped another bride and groom offset the cost of their dream wedding. It's a win-win!

Forget Dinner, Do Brunch:

Most traditional weddings take place during early evening hours with dinner provided for each guest. Unfortunately, the most usual practice is also the most expensive. - Popcorn it's not just for the movies! Popcorn is not only inexpensive, but it's easy to make, cheap, tastes great and as an added bonus has almost no calories (when eaten plain). Why not offer a variety of flavored popcorns at your next event? Popcorn can come in savory flavors like cheese, ranch, or lightly salted, you can go for the sweet and salty kettle corn variety, or go sweet with carmel corn or chocolate drizzled popcorn. There are so many options! Makes a good party favor too.
- Nachos go south of the border for a tasty and cheap party food. Put out a bowl of corn chips along with some warm nacho cheese sauce and some salsa. It doesn't have to be fancy and like popcorn, nachos can be quite filling!
- Fruit and veggies for a lighter fare, put out carrot sticks, celery, sliced apples, cucumber spears, baby tomatoes, mandarin orange bits, and other favorites. - One drink to rule them all For many people, a party isn't a party until you let your hair down and enjoy an adult beverage. While alcohol may add a bit of fun to your party, it is also expensive. If you go that route, Stick to a single inexpensive beverage or try some fun fancy non-alcoholic options like blueberry lemonade, or grape citrus sparkling punch. Another possibility is a BYOB (bring your own bottle) party. Simply ask guests to bring along a bottle (or can) of their favorite drink to enjoy at the festivities.
